As we move through an exciting term for the Malaysian Society of Nephrology (MSN), I am grateful for your continued support, energy, and friendship. Together, we are turning our shared vision of accessible, affordable, and sustainable kidney care into concrete action.

One of our biggest milestones this year is the successful organisation of the 39th MSN Annual Congress, which was held in conjunction with the 11th APCM-ISPD 2025 at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre from 3-7 September 2025. This joint meeting, under the theme "Transforming and Empowering Success in PD," has brought together colleagues from across Malaysia, the Asia-Pacific region, and beyond to share knowledge, build skills, and strengthen collaboration in peritoneal dialysis and nephrology care.

Another flagship effort is the National CKD Roadshow, which has begun its journey across the country. Through these workshops, we aim to support primary care doctors and other front-line healthcare professionals to better detect, stage, and manage CKD, with a strong focus on prevention, early referral, lifestyle counselling, and optimised use of guideline-directed therapies. Our goal is simple: to delay progression, reduce the need for dialysis, and improve the lives of patients and families in every state.

In parallel, MSN has also embarked on several key strategic initiatives that will shape kidney care in Malaysia for years to come. These include the Green Nephrology Initiative, which looks at how we can make dialysis and kidney care more environmentally sustainable; the Rare Kidney Disease Workgroup and Registry, which aims to better understand and support patients living with rare kidney disorders; and the ADPKD Practical Guide & Position Statement, developed in collaboration with the Singapore Society of Nephrology, to help clinicians manage autosomal dominant polycystic kidney disease more confidently in everyday practice.

These three initiatives are significant enough to deserve their own stories, and I am pleased to share that each will be highlighted in separate sections of this newsletter. I encourage you to read them and reflect on how they connect with your daily work.

Thank you once again for walking this journey with MSN. Your commitment - whether in clinics, dialysis centres, research units, or the community - is what gives real meaning to every program we launch. I look forward to continued support from everyone towards better care of people living with kidney disease in this country.

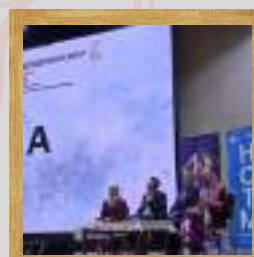

CONGRESS HIGHLIGHTS: EMPOWERING SUCCESS IN PD

- The 39th MSN Congress was a landmark event, held jointly with the 11th APCM-ISPD from September 3-7, 2025.
- The theme, "Transforming & Empowering Success in Peritoneal Dialysis," brought together global and regional experts to share the latest innovations in renal care.
- The week was filled with a world-class scientific programme, including practical workshops, robust abstract presentations, and valuable networking for all delegates.



A GLOBAL GATHERING: BY THE NUMBERS

The congress was a resounding success, attracting a total of 1,828 participants, including 1,407 delegates and 108 faculty speakers. Truly an international affair, we welcomed 588 international delegates and faculty representing 44 countries globally. The event was supported by a robust industry presence, featuring 164 sponsors and exhibitors who showcased the latest innovations in renal care.

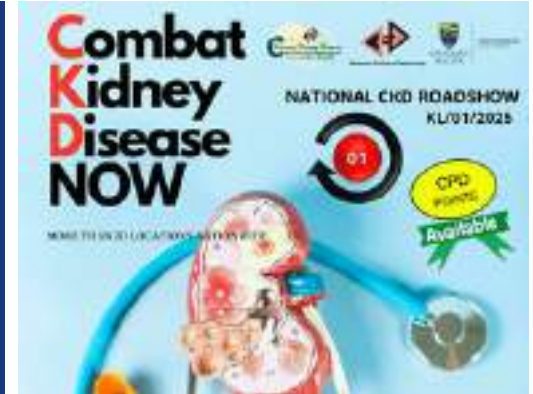
PARTICIPANTS

NRR'S STRATEGIC VISIT TO ANZDATA

INSIGHTS FROM DOWN UNDER
A VISIT TO SAHMRI

We would like to extend our sincere thanks to NRR and MSN for the opportunity to visit South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute (SAHMRI) from 2nd to 5th June 2025 to gain deeper insights into the operations of the ANZDATA registry.

During the visit, we gained comprehensive understanding of the critical role of registries like ANZDATA play in research, quality improvement, and in influencing clinical practice and policy changes. The ANZDATA registry's structured approach provides a robust platform for collecting, analyzing and applying data related to kidney diseases across Australia and New Zealand. This will be good reference for our local registry in running with similar approach. Key highlights during the visit included touring various sections of ANZDATA registry, session with data request and management team, biostatistician team who provided an overview of statistical methodologies such as analyzing registry data and meeting with applications and database team, where we discussed infrastructure and data governance and system design to tackle missing data.

We also had valuable opportunity to interact with nephrologist and epidemiologist who generously shared their experiences and challenges in managing and utilizing registry data to drive improvement in patient outcomes and healthcare delivery. We also explored ongoing projects particularly Kidney Transplant, PD registry and other sub studies for possible collaboration in future.

Overall, it was an excellent and enriching experience that reinforced the pivotal role of data-driven decision making in nephrology. We are grateful for the hospitality and knowledge shared by ANZDATA team and looking forward to exploring collaborative opportunities in future.

From Awareness to Action: Closing the Gaps in AKI Care Across Clinical Settings



From Awareness to Action: Closing the Gaps in AKI Care

The 3rd MSN Critical Care Nephrology (CCN) Masterclass was successfully held on 24–25 October 2025 at Hospital Canselor Tuanku Muhriz (UKM). Themed "Closing the Gaps in AKI Care," the event continued MSN's mission to enhance acute kidney injury management across clinical settings. It was a landmark event for critical care education in Malaysia.

An Overwhelming Response

The event attracted an overwhelming 250 participants, comprising nephrologists, intensivists, physicians, and nurses from across Malaysia. The two-day scientific programme featured four symposia that addressed key aspects of critical care nephrology ranging from AKI prevention and management, cardio-renal interactions, to sepsis-associated AKI and post-AKI care.



Distinguish International Faculty

We were honoured to host renowned experts including Prof Dr Nattachai Srisawat (Thailand), Prof Dr Peh Chen Au (Australia), and Dr Manish Kaushik (Singapore). Together with local key opinion leaders, they delivered cutting-edge insights into sepsis-associated AKI and critical care management.

MEETING WITH YBMK DR DZULKEFLY AHMAD

PD-FIRST: PROGRESS AND POTENTIAL

Since its introduction and reinforced by recent Ministry of Health initiatives in 2022, the PD-First policy has laid a solid foundation for home-based kidney care. While government facilities currently report PD uptake rates of 30-40%, there remains significant potential to expand their reach, particularly in underserved and rural areas.

On 3rd September 2025, a meeting was held with YBMK, organised in collaboration with the International Society for Peritoneal Dialysis (ISPD) and patient representatives. The primary goal was to advocate for Malaysia's PD-First policy—a strategy prioritising Peritoneal Dialysis (PD) for

patients with End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD)—by highlighting its benefits, addressing current challenges, and securing strong governmental support for its successful implementation

CALL TO ACTION

To realise the full potential of PD-First, the meeting sought YBMK's strong backing for initiatives such as enhanced training programs, public awareness campaigns, and potential incentives to increase PD uptake. The message was clear: by strengthening these key support areas, Malaysia can make PD-First a resounding success, for patients, caregivers, and the healthcare system alike.



Why It Matters? Rare kidney diseases are individually uncommon but collectively remain a major cause of CKD, ESRD, and childhood kidney failure. In Malaysia, diagnosis is often delayed due to limited access to genetic testing, incomplete data, and fragmented care pathways

The **Malaysian Society of Nephrology (MSN)**, in collaboration with the **National Kidney Foundation (NKF)**, is committed to bridging this gap through early detection, precision diagnostics, and capacity building



KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- * Malaysian–Singapore ADPKD Consensus: Co-developing a binational diagnosis & treatment guideline for ADPKD
- * A pilot study assessing Epidemiology & Treatment Gap of ADPKD in Malaysia – abstract presented at the 39th MSN Annual Congress.
- * A study evaluating the Long-term Outcomes in IgA Nephropathy Registry-linked analysis – abstract presented during 39th MSN Annual Congress.
- * Development of a Simplified RKD Data Platform. This is embedded within the pre-existing MRRB, enabling streamlined national data capture.
- * Securing Long-Term Registry Funding with support from National Kidney Foundation and industry partners for RKD registry development and maintenance.



Core strategy: Improving Early Detection

- **Standardized "Red-Flag" criteria:** Developing guidelines for primary, secondary and tertiary care to recognize RKD sooner
- **Diagnostic Pathways:** Creating national algorithms for glomerular, cystic, and congenital nephropathies, supported by accessible genetic testing and enhanced renal pathology services (including electron microscopy)

The Malaysian Rare Kidney Disease Registry

We are developing a national registry harmonized with the existing National Renal Biopsy Registry (MRRB) and MDTR

- **Purpose:** To support policy development, strengthen funding for high-cost therapies, and provide a robust research platform.
- **Progress:** A simplified RKD data platform has already been embedded within the MRRB for streamlined data capture

Developed jointly by clinicians from both countries, this guide reflects a shared commitment to improving the care of people living with autosomal dominant polycystic kidney disease (ADPKD).

Fellowship in Glomerular Disease: Leicester, UK

The Call to Specialisation

I developed a deep interest in glomerular diseases following my specialty training, driven by the field's rapid growth and the emergence of game-changing treatments. This progress encouraged me to seek practical, hands-on experience beyond my GlomCon Fellowship. Through a connection kindly facilitated by Dr Rosnawati, I was truly fortunate to be accepted for an attachment in Leicester by Professor Jonathan Barratt, a world-renowned expert.

Overcoming the Hurdles

The journey was made possible by the ISN Fellowship Grant, though the administrative process for the GMC and visa was quite daunting. I successfully navigated these hurdles thanks to the invaluable support of Dr Sunita Bavanandan, Dr Lily Mushahar, Dr Fariz Safhan, and my dear colleagues.

Highlights and Global Connections

A major highlight of the fellowship was the opportunity to engage with global experts at the ISN Expert Forum on Complement Therapeutics in C3G and IgAN in Budapest, as well as the International Symposium on IgA Nephropathy in Prague. I was also honoured to present a challenging case of refractory IgA vasculitis during the ISN Primer Course in Glomerular Diseases in Prague.

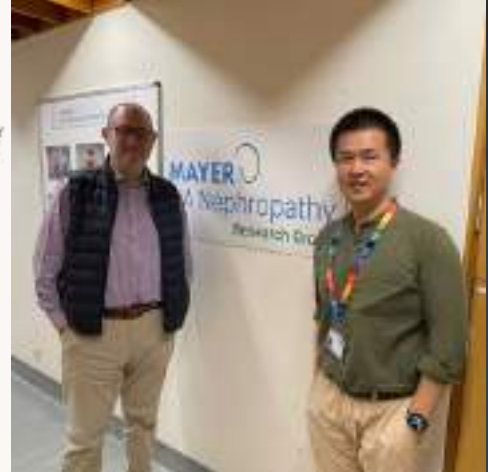
Deep Dive into Glomerular Diseases

In Leicester, I ran specialised glomerulonephritis, lupus, and vasculitis clinics, gaining confidence through post-clinic discussions with Dr Chee Kay Cheung and Professor Barratt. The opportunity to use newer therapies like targeted-release budesonide, avacopan, and voclosporin was both exciting and eye-opening. My experience extended to the Mayer IgA Nephropathy Laboratory, where I acquired hands-on skills in performing ELISA, and participated in the conduct of clinical trials with outstanding renal research unit team. In parallel, I deepened my understanding of renal pathology through workshops at Imperial College London and local biopsy meetings. Additionally, attending investigator meetings across Europe provided me with valuable insights and the joy of cultural exploration.

Gratitude and Future Vision

Professor Jonathan Barratt and Dr Chee Kay Cheung are exceptional mentors. They are approachable for case discussions and generous in providing learning opportunities and professional connections.

The year flew by, filled with growth, learning, and friendships that I will always cherish. I have now returned home and look forward to contributing to my country and advancing care for patients with glomerular diseases. Lastly, I hope that more young nephrologists will explore the opportunity to broaden their knowledge and expertise by pursuing further training in specialised fields. This will undoubtedly help to strengthen our nephrology fraternity.

A FELLOWSHIP DOWN UNDER

Expanding Horizons in Kidney Transplantation



Kidney transplantation (KT) has always been my passion as the most meaningful intervention for end-stage kidney disease. After completing my subspecialty training in 2022, I was privileged to join the transplant team at the National Kidney Transplant Centre (NKTC) at Hospital Kuala Lumpur (HKL).


While our living donor programme remains the backbone, we have worked hard to expand our donor pool. We introduced ABO-incompatible KT and have seen deceased donor rates rise to around 80 annually. However, allocation challenges remain. Motivated to learn from a different healthcare system, I embarked on a fellowship in Perth under the mentorship of Professor Wai Lim.

The journey began with a six-month application process involving formal interviews and approvals from both Malaysian and Australian authorities. It was a rigorous path, and I am deeply grateful to Dr. Sunita Bavanandan and my colleagues at HKL for their unwavering guidance and support throughout.


Relocating a family of five overseas was a significant undertaking, yet we managed to settle in within two weeks. I officially commenced my fellowship at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital (SCGH) on 1st July 2024, ready to navigate a new clinical environment.

Over the next 12 months, I gained invaluable insight into Australia's kidney allocation system and complex waitlisting assessments. I particularly valued the weekly multidisciplinary meetings and the unique opportunity to train directly with the immunology team, which deepened my understanding of cross-matching workflows.

Beyond the hospital, we cherished our time exploring the stunning landscapes of Western Australia, from Margaret River to Kalbarri. This fellowship was a journey of resilience and discovery, and I strongly encourage my fellow nephrologists to take the leap and embrace the chance to learn from global systems.

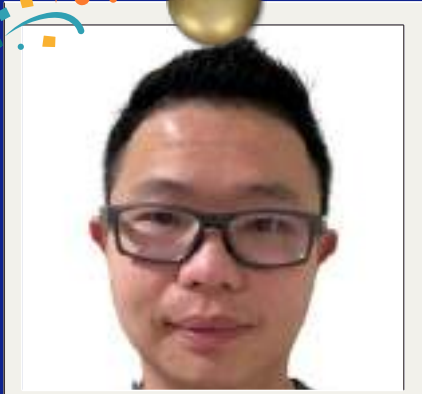

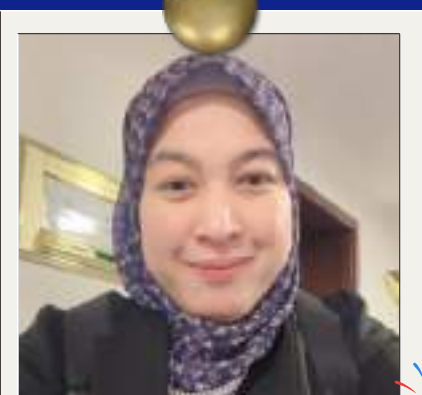
